
READING FOR PLEASURE


SEPTEMBER'S SLI STAR PUPIL

THE Study Links Star Pupil for September is Lionel Will from Kelly College in Tavistock. Lionel is from Germany and he joined Kelly College this September. As well as studying hard in England, Lionel is also working on a very interesting project in Germany. His brief is to 'enhance the quality of life for physically handicapped people'. Lionel's mother, Mrs Boy-Will, kindly translated the abstract for us. This is what Lionel and his project partner, Julia, plan to do. 'We want to develop a robotic arm that is capable of feeding a patient with liquids, food and medicine. Our main focus will be

tetraplegics (people who cannot use any of their limbs) since there is often only a very limited budget to help with rehabilitation in these cases. It is our main aim to develop a cheap system. Our robot should be a part of a bed-table in hospital. This makes it different from the existing robots, such as 'Rhoni' or 'Armor'. We want to build a prototype and then do research on



how well it functions. We are doing the research in close cooperation with Prof Dr Jürgen Stettin at the Hamburg University of Applied Sciences in Germany.' At Study Links we think it is wonderful for someone so young to embark on such a worthwhile project. This robot, and the research done during its development, could improve the lives of many people.
